The Kenyan has invented the Jesse Jackson Were 25(JJW25) special black boots that have been part of his exciting journey of tormenting opposition goalkeepers.



Last season, FAZ barred fans from accessing stadia across the country following the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic.

"It is with great pleasure that we welcome you all to the Levy Mwanawasa stadium following the Football Association of Zambia's (FAZ) announcement to allow fans backin stadia.

"Football is a gregarious sport on and off the pitch. The absence of fans in our stands had not only deprived this football club of the much-needed financial revenue but also took away the chemistry and bond that exists between our players and their supporters.

We strongly believe that our supporters' physical presence during our matches has for some time been the difference between success and failure," Mulenga said.

The ZESCO United CEO added that the club's success on and off the pitch is owed to the unwavering support the team continues to receive from its supporters.

"We are greatly aware that the decision by the authorities to bar fans from attending football matches was purely meant to safeguard the lives of millions of Zambians from the COVID-19 pandemic.

"As such, I wish to take this opportunity to appeal to our supporters across the country to adhere to COVID-19 measures stipulated by the Zambian Government through the Ministry of Health.

ZESCO United management believes that sport can change and save lives. Therefore, our clarion call to all our fervent supporters' home and abroad, is to be great ambassadors of governments fight against COVID-19 pandemic by adhering to various critical health guidelines."

Meanwhile ZESCO United fans praised the local football governing body for opening gates to the local football faithfuls in the midst of the pandemic.





Former ZESCO United Supporters Club Chairman, Enerst Phiri said: "Firstly, I wish to thank Government through the Ministry of Health and the FAZ for this wonderful gesture shown to football fans across the country. The return of the 12th man in the stadia will have significant effects on the league. Playing football matches in empty stadia had a huge negative bearing on the success of the teams who could no longer enjoy the home ground advantage."

Phiri has also appealed to fans across the country to follow COVID-19 preventive measures during all the games.

## 'I AM TALLER THAN YOU! S. SUDANESE CAPTAIN SECURES WORK PERMIT

eter Maker Manyang is yet to kick a ball in ZESCO United colours. However, the South Sudanese defender has already set new records for himself.

The lanky 27-year-old defender is the first South Sudanese player to grace the Zambian Super League since the little dinky country become an independent nation.

Standing at 1.98 meters, Manyang is not only the tallest player to have played for ZESCO United but he is arguably going to be the tallest professional footballer to feature in the Zambian league thus far.

Having secured a 2-year move to ZESCO United, the defender has grappled for game time owing to challenges in securing a work permit.

Last month, Manyang's dream of playing for ZESCO United came to reality when the Zambian Immigration granted the ZESCO United defender a work permit.

"I am super excited with this news because I can't wait to play for ZESCO United. I said this when I first arrived in Zambia that my ambition is to help the team succeed. My progress had been frustrated because of work permit issues. I am happy this issue has finally been settled," he said.

Manyang recently led South Sudan in two international friendlies which saw the former draw 1-all against Sierra Leone before losing 2-0 at the hands of Morocco.



The start of the 2021/22 MTN Zambian Super League season gave way to a host of new signings for the league defending champions, ZESCO United.

Dickson Chapa penned a 1-year loan move from Napsa Stars while Edward Lungu ditched Kitwe United for a lucrative 2-year move to the Ndola based league giants.

South Sudanese defender Peter Maker Manyang joined ZESCO United while Spencer Sautu and Gregory Sanjase switched loyalties from Green Eagles and Young Green Eagles respectively.

The newcomers have not taken long to settle at their new home with Dickson Chapa and Edward Lungu scoring their debut goals.

Chapa was on the scoresheet when ZESCO United humiliated Kansanshi Dynamos 4-0 in a rescheduled fixture played at the Levy Mwanawasa stadium.

The 24-year-old enterprising defensive midfielder dream is to win his first league title with ZESCO United seem to be on course.

"I was very excited when I heard that ZESCO United were interested in signing me. I was very happy because it shows that my efforts in the game are being appreciated especially when a team like ZESCO United come calling.

This is a very organized club with a rich history. I feel that they have seen something in me which they want to use to add value to the team. I also want to ensure that I contribute to the club's growth by winning titles," Chapa said after securing a 1-year loan move.

Former Kitwe United exciting winger Edward Lungu is another gem that ZESCO United could not ignore in the transfer market.

The 21-year-old winger has been outstanding for the champions scoring in his debut goal during the 2021 Charity Shield final that saw ZESCO United demolition Lusaka Dynamos 4-0.

Lungu said:" This goal takes away a lot of pressure especially that people are expecting a lot from me. ZESCO United is a big club as such it is important for me to start the new season on a high.

"I am grateful to the entire team for the support. There is a lot of pressure here to deliver. Everyone is working hard to be in the team."


Lungu went on to open his league account in ZESCO United's 2-0 victory against Chambeshi Football Club.

ZESCO United's race to retain the league title keeps getting exciting with the defending champions occupying third position on the league table with 14 points having played nine games while Nkwazi and Green Buffaloes occupy second and first position with 18 and 21 points respectively having played a game better than the champions.









ESCO United's quest to defend the 2021/22 MTN Zambian Super League title has slowly started to take shape.

Following their disappointing elimination from the coveted CAF Champions League in the first phase of the qualifying series, the Zambian league champions have channeled all their energies towards keeping the coveted title in Ndola for the tenth time.

The month of September started on a high for the champions, with ZESCO United beating Chambeshi 2-0 in their opening league fixture.

Victory against Chambeshi was followed by another convincing 2-0 win against Indeni in the famous Ndola derby.

The champions, however could not make it three consecutive victories when they faced MTN Super League promoted side Kafue Celtics.

ZESCO United went down 2-0 ending the month of September on a very disappointing note.

The league champions returned to action after the FIFA international break with a mouthwatering fixture to Kabwe Warriors.

Goals from Solomon Sakala and Jesse Were were enough for the champions to open the month of October on a high.

However, the month of October would become slightly bumpy for the champions losing 1-0 to Nkana before trouncing Kansanshi Dynamos 4-0.

Victory against Kansanshi Dynamos was followed by a 1-all draw against league leaders Green Buffaloes and MTN promoted side Konkola Blades.

October curtains were finally drawn to a close with ZESCO United occupying the third





position on the league table with 14 points while Nkwazi and Green Buffaloes cemented the second and first position with 18 and 21 points respectively having played a game better than the champions.

ZESCO United Head Coach Numba Mumamba is already working tirelessly to resuscitate the fortunes of the reigning league champions ahead of what promises to be an explosive November.

Green Eagles, Prison Leopards, Forest Rangers and Buildcon are some of the mouthwatering fixtures that await the Ndola based league giants.

"Our team has struggled a bit since we resumed the league. What we have seen so far is exactly what we saw last season. We were slow starters because most of our senior players are slow to hit their peak. They have slightly struggled.

"We have been talking to everyone about the urgent need to start grinding out results especially that we are almost getting to the half mark of the league. So far, we are seeing some light at the end of the tunnel looking at the way the team is now playing," Mumamba said.

Mumamba bemoaned the lack of consistency from his side:" We are emphasizing on consistency which is crucial to us. Our focus has been in areas where we are not doing well especially the striking force. The team is creating chances but failing to score. This was the story against Buffaloes.

"I was impressed that we created fewer scoring chances against Kansanshi Dynamos but ended up scoring all the few opportunities we had on target. Our conversion rate needs to improve a lot."

Mumamba's biggest agony has been the number of injuries that plagued his side last month.

"Injuries have been our biggest challenge. We are hoping Kalengo is back quickly in the team. Adrian started training this week, but he is till feeling a bit of pain in his leg while Ian Otieno had a full week of training last week. We expect him to make the cut this coming Saturday," he concluded.









ike many young footballers with humble beginnings, Mukuka's sharp rise in the game has not only been exacerbated by his desire to one-day become a star player for Zambia but also due to his yearning to one day become his family's breadwinner.

Like the late Argentine legendary striker, Diego Armando Maradona and PSG's Lionel Messi whose relentless pursuit for success on the field was partly catapulted by a great desire to lift their families out of abject poverty, Chanda has already assumed the role of provider with great Oomph.

At 20, Chanda knows that he may just be that window of hope for his family beyond the scars of poverty.

"I have been raised by a single parent. My mother is ever encouraging me to work hard because she believes that through football, I can start providing for the family. She is always encouraging me to push harder and focus on the game."

Early this year, Chanda made a surprise move from Ndola's Lower Division side, Gomes to Zambian Super League giants ZESCO United on a 2-year loan move.

It didn't take long for the young attacking midfielder to show why Numba Mumamba made him one of his first signings when he joined the Zambian league champions as Head coach.







"I couldn't believe it when I was first told that ZESCO United wanted to sign me because this is a big club with a lot of star players. It was only when my manager called me that I took the story seriously, recalls Chanda.

"It didn't take too long for me to settle because the senior players here have been very helpful especially Kelvin Kampamba. He encouraged me a lot not to be scared and to work hard. I always wanted to play for ZESCO United because it is a big club in Zambia."

Since signing for the league champions, Chanda has flourished in the middle of the park owing to the support he continues to receive from ZESCO United's senior players.

"It has been surprisingly easy for me to settle here. I was initially scared because there are a lot of big talented players here and am a small boy. There is Donashano, Kamusoko, Rusike and Ching'andu.

"I was scared that I was not going to get enough game time. However, it has been easy to play because of the support I got from all the senior players. I am particularly excited to play alongside Kamusoko, Rusike or John because they don't shout at me when I make mistakes."

With a handful of Zambian players taking some of the finest European leagues by storm, Chanda is optimistic he will one day make his dream move to Europe.

"It is amazing to watch Enock Mwepu, Fashion Sakala and Patson Daka playing in Europe. Their breakthrough is motivating to every young player to work extra hard. I know I am still developing but I have hope that in 2-3 seasons, I can also see myself playing in Europe."

An ardent follower of Zambian International Midfield maestro, Clatous Chota Chama, Chanda is working hard to perfect his art.

"I like Clatous because he can create opportunities and score. It is something that I want to see develop in my style of play. I can

pass, dribble but I am not scoring goals which is something crucial for a player like me. I am working hard to achieve this target."

"It is a great achievement to win the league with ZESCO United. Everyone wants to win the league as such am very proud that I was able to do that in my first season with the club. I am working hard to ensure that we continue on the same path even this season."
